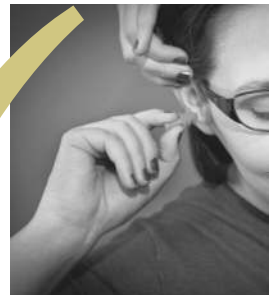


NOISE COMPLIANCE CHECKLIST

Get ready for OSHA's Regional Noise Hazard Emphasis Program.



Compliance Tasks

Y/N

1. Have current and documented sound level mapping.	
2. Complete dosimetry in areas where sound levels were 80 decibels (dB) or greater.	
3. Conduct and document additional monitoring when a change in production, process, equipment or controls may increase noise exposures.	
4. Ensure employees were notified of monitoring results.	
5. Ensure two years of noise measurement records are available.	
6. Ensure a hearing conservation program is in place for employees with average exposure of 85 dBA/8-hour day, 83.4 dBA/10-hour shift and 82.1 dBA/12 hour shift.	
7. Audiograms have been conducted within the last 12 months.	
8. Conduct audiograms for new employees within 6 months of hire.	
9. Enter your Standard Threshold Shift (STS) on the OSHA 300 log.	
10. Have current and five year historical OSHA 300 logs available.	
11. Evaluate hearing protectors for adequacy (as compared to measured sound levels.)	
12. Have a current written hearing conservation program.	
13. Train (according to items listed in 1910.95(k)(3)) employees exposed at or above an 8-hour average of 85 dB.	
14. Make annual training records available.	
15. Post or make available OSHA standard 1910.95.
